**Thetford, Norfolk, Guided Walking Tour + Viking Exhibition. 1.00 pm Fri 9<sup>th</sup> June. £10 pp.**

Visit to excavations of the **Lost Church of Wenden Parva, Saffron Walden, Essex. 10.30 am Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July, lasting 45 mins-1hr. FREE.** Following earlier resistivity survey, a community archaeological evaluation revealed the apsidal foundations of the 'lost' early 11thC Wenden Parva church which was demolished around 1662. Important medieval burials have been discovered at the site, at least one C14 dated to between 897-953AD which pre-dates the church. CBA East has awarded a grant to Wendens Ambo Society to help towards post-excavation analysis. This is a small site on private property so numbers are LIMITED. Please note that there are no facilities on site. **Cambridge IAG – Can you ever have enough Pye?** by **Dr Mike Kemp**, one of the creators of Cambridge Museum of Technology's current exhibition, Radio Enters the Home.

The talk traces the development of radio, broadcasting and the Pye company as radio came into people's homes for the first time. Broadcasting started in 1922 with the formation of the British Broadcasting Company. In the same year in Cambridge, scientific instrument maker WG Pye & Co set up a small radio department. By 1932, the BBC was a public corporation and half the homes in the country had a radio. Pye, now making 40,000 radios a year, was well on its way to becoming the largest company in Cambridge and one of the country's best-known manufacturers.

The talk will take place in the Pye Building at Cambridge Museum of Technology. Entrance on the night is via the Museum's Cheddars Lane gate.

People attending the talk will have the chance to look around the exhibition.

**The Vikings: History on your doorstep**

This fascinating exhibition explores the exciting history of the Vikings in Thetford and the surrounding area and the impact of their presence and culture.

Beautiful objects on loan from the British Museum alongside impressive Viking artefacts from the collections of Norfolk Museums Service and Suffolk County Council chart the Viking story in East Anglia – from the time of their initial raids along the east coast around 1,200 years ago, through 200 years of integration and settlement and the creation of an Anglo-Scandinavian culture.

Visitors are able to find out about the area on the eve of the Viking attacks in the 9th century, the invading ‘Great Viking Army’ which overwintered in Thetford and life in the major Viking period town of Thetford which became the sixth largest town in the country.

The Chapel of St Peter-on-the-Wall, built on the ruins of a Roman fort, dates from the mid-seventh century and is one of the oldest largely intact churches in England. It stands in splendid isolation on the shoreline at the mouth of the Blackwater Estuary in Essex, where the land meets and interpenetrates with the sea and the sky. This book brings together contributors from across the arts, humanities and social sciences to uncover the pre-modern contexts and modern resonances of this medieval building and its landscape setting.

The impetus for this collection was the recently published designs for a new nuclear power station at Bradwell-on-Sea, which, if built, would have a significant impact on the chapel and its landscape setting. *St Peter-on-the-Wall* highlights the multiple ways in which the chapel and landscape are historically and archaeologically significant, while also drawing attention to the modern importance of Bradwell as a place of Christian worship, of sanctuary and of cultural production.

**The Dissolution of the colleges by Henry VIII by Associate Professor Peter Bloore (UEA)**

The dissolution of the colleges by Henry VIII – the greatest act of theft in the history of the charity sector in England. And it started in Suffolk.

Cardinal Wolsey started dissolving the smaller colleges and religious houses in Suffolk, so that he could fund his own Cambridge College. This set the idea for the avalanche of dissolutions of the colleges and monasteries later carried out by protestant radical Thomas Cromwell. Everyone knows about the monasteries. What is less well known is that the mediaeval college system carried out most of the education and charitable support in England, far more than the more famous monasteries. This lecture will explain what the mediaeval college system did across England, with special reference to Suffolk and Wingfield College in particular, and what happened when those colleges were suddenly dissolved, leaving a major hole in the fabric of education and charitable support across the county and the country.
